

## 2019-20 CLUB CONTEST POINTS INSTRUCTIONS

There will be three (3) divisions for the year 2019-20:

Under 30 members (small)
31-60 members (medium)
61 & up members (large)

- A. 1 Club receives 1000 points for each net gain of one Lion using June 30, 2019 MMR/MyLCI
- A. 2 Club receives points as indicated below for percentage gained using June 30, 2020 MMR/MyLCI
  - 25 to 49% - 4000 points
  - 50 to 74% - 10000 points
  - 75 to 99% - 17000 points
  - 100% - 25000 points
- B. 1 Club receives 2 points for each dollar spent on sight and service projects
- B. 2 Club receives 1 point for each dollar spent on other projects
- B. 3 Club receives 2 points for each hour spent on fundraising or service projects. Mileage can be converted at the rate of 30 miles equals 1 point. Leo hours count. (Club Meeting & Visit hours do not count.)
- B. 4 Club receives 3 points for each EyeWill/Donor cards turned in
- B. 5 Club receives 125 points for each hearing aid turned in.
- B. 6 Club receives 3 points for each pair of used eyeglasses turned in.
- B. 7 Club receives 5 points for each ink jet cartridge turned in.
- B. 8 Club receives 10 points for each laser toner cartridge turned in.
- B. 9 Club receives 25 points for each used cell telephone turned in.
- B.10 Club receives 100 points for each screening session through KidSight Outreach
- B.11 Club receives 10 points for each child screened through KidSight Outreach.
- B.12 Club receives 100 points for each screening session in schools / community. Hearing other than KidSight
- B.13 Club receives 10 points for each person screened.
- B.14 Club receives 5000 points for sponsoring a new Lions Club.
- B.15 Club receives 2000 points for sponsoring a new or existing Leo Club.
- B.16 Club receives 1000 points for sponsoring a Lion of the Year by February 28.
- B.17 Club receives 1000 points for sponsoring a Lion of the Decade by February 28.
- B.18 Club receives 1000 points for naming a Melvin Jones Fellow.
- B.19 Club receives 250 points for paying first semi-annual International Dues by August 1.
- B.20 Club receives 250 points for paying second semi-annual International Dues by February 1.
- B.21 Club receives 250 points for paying first semi-annual District Dues by September 1.
- B.22 Club receives 250 points for paying second semi-annual District Dues by March 1.
- B.23 Club receives 250 points for each program presented at Club Meetings.
- B.24 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Virginia Lindsey candidate by February 28.
- B.25 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Lindsey/Jennings candidate.
- B.26 Club receives 1000 points for submitting a Tennessee Lions Hall of Fame candidate.
- B.27 Club receives 1000 points for submitting the contest report form by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the following month.
- B.28 Club receives 1000 points if New Officers' Report form (PU-101) is submitted by March 31.
- B.29 Club receives 1000 points for publishing a club newsletter. (Maximum two)

C.1 Clubs having the following percent of its total membership visiting another Club, attending Zone, Region, District, MD-12 meetings, a Lions Convention, LLR or Lions International Headquarters during the month will receive the following points:

5 -9%	500 points	30-49%	4,000 points	<b style="color: red;">NOTE: Each day of the LLR and District Convention counts as a visit.</b>
10-19%	1,000 points	50-74%	6,000 points	
20-29%	2,000 points	75-99%	10,000 points	

If 10 Lions visit a club or attend a zone meeting, that is 10 visits. If 5 Lions visit a club and then the same 5 Lions attend a zone meeting later in the month, that is 10 visits.

**NOTE:** Fundraising project money spent does not count as money spent for reporting in either B.1 or B.2.  
 Example: A club purchases pecans to sell as a fundraising project and pays \$20,000.00 when the pecans are shipped. This \$20,000.00 is not reported in either B.1 or B.2. You do report hours spent during the sale of the pecans in B.3. Mileage counts using 30 miles equals one point.
